

# REGIONAL STANDARDS COMMITTEE MINUTES

DATE: April 26, 2007

1. Tim Stanton called the meeting to order.
2. March Meeting Minutes: Meeting minutes were approved.

5. Report by Subcommittee Chairs:

Editorial: Tim Stanton reported that the Editorial Committee did not meet this month.

Traffic/Lighting/Electrical: No report.

Structures: Dirk Epperson was not present to report.

Drainage/NPDES: Debbie Day was not present to report.

Roads/Streets: Dennis Davies was not present to report.

Landscaping: Mark Caro reported that he has received several revisions that the subcommittee will review.

6. New Business:
  - a. Inquiry about the sale of the RSD books. Sandy stated that the books are for sale at the Land Development Counter in the County Annex at 5201 Ruffin Road. The RSD book and the Greenbook with Supplement are also available for sale at [www.thattechnicalbookstore.com](http://www.thattechnicalbookstore.com)
  - b. Paul Vo, City of San Marcos, inquired about backfill for trenches. The City of San Marcos requires an SE of 20 for backfilling trenches. The County of San Diego uses an SE of 30 for pipe bedding, but allows native to be used for backfilling pipes @ 90% R.C. Poway, Escondido

and SDG&E discussed the use of 1 or 2 sack slurry backfill.

Suggestions for using an alternate bid for slurry and for SE of 20, also for using a slurry only for the top 5' of backfill to provide for bridging.

- c. Blair Knoll, City of Encinitas, discussed how the use of pervious concrete for road improvements can result in the water draining into the subgrade. When this happens it results in a loose of the fines in the subgrade.
- d. Discussion of Water Pollution Control Issues related to hydromodification.
